# **Integrating Innovation and Development Policies** for the Forest Sector

# **CYPRUS REPORT**

Department of Forests Nicosia October, 2007

### **Abstract**

Even though the development and absorption of new knowledge and innovation in general are important variables of growth, the adoption of strategic measures for the promotion of innovation in Cyprus are still at an infant stage.

The factors constraining development of innovation in Cyprus are the small size of enterprises, the low level of technology in the private sector and the limited capacity to carry out research in science and engineering fields. Therefore, Cyprus concentrates more on the diffusion of innovations and efficient products rather than on their development.

As a result, the performance of Cyprus in the area of innovation is low by international comparison. The Summary Innovation Index of Cyprus (SII) was at 0.17 for 2004 while the corresponding EU average was 0.33 (National Reform Programme of Cyprus, Sept. 2005)

For the requirements of the first phase of the COST Action E51 "Integrating Innovation and Development Policies for the Forest Sector", the following policy documents have been analyzed by the COST action member Antonis Horattas:

- 1. The National Forest Programme,
- 2. The National Lisbon Programme,
- 3. The Rural Development Plan 2007 2013,
- 4. The Strategic Development Plan 2004 2006 and
- 5. The Renewable Energy Policy.

For the time being, there is neither a Sustainable Development Policy nor a Forest-based Industries Policy available.

For the analysis of the available policy documents, the data collection guidelines and data collection templates of December 2006 have been used.

From this work, it is clearly concluded that the issue of innovation is still new for Cyprus. None of the measures related to innovation and presented in the analyzed documents concerns forestry.
